Dear Community Provider,

As you may or may not know, Crisis Services in conjunction with Erie County and local domestic violence service providers, began operation of a Domestic Violence (DV) Advocate Helpline (716-862-HELP {4357}) in January 2012. The goal was to streamline hotline access for survivors and provide information on the available domestic violence resources in Erie County. Since that time, the Helpline has successfully provided 24-hour immediate accessibility to non-residential Domestic Violence services. Crisis Services staff and volunteers should be commended for their outstanding service to thousands of survivors through its Advocate Helpline.

Unfortunately, and as a result of lost funding from the New York State Office for the Prevention of Domestic Violence through an RFP process, the dedicated Advocate Helpline will be discontinued effective 10/1/2021. However, Crisis Services and the other domestic violence services providers will continue to provide Domestic Violence service accessibility through their respective hotlines:
